A Word from the PASTOR



Easter baskets, Easter bonnets, Easter candy, Easter dresses, Easter eggs, Easter lilies, the Easter Bunny...Easter! Easter! Easter! For all the attention that Easter receives, I sometimes wonder whether we really do it justice.

Easter is a big part, but only part, of a bigger story. In order to conquer death, Jesus first had to die. Before he died, Jesus taught and led his disciples and left them with his legacy.

Holy Week is the week before Easter where we are offered the opportunity to retell and relive the final week of Jesus' life. It begins with the story of Jesus entering Jerusalem with his disciples to a hero's welcome—a ticker tape parade, if you will—on Palm Sunday. How could anyone along that parade route have known that the events of the week would take such a horrible turn. On Maundy Thursday we enter into the Upper Room where Jesus and his disciples ate the Passover Seder meal. We don't only remember Jesus instituting the sacrament of Communion, we also are reminded of Jesus' servant heart and his commandment that we serve others with the same love and humility he has shown us. His disciples did not know that evening just to what lengths Jesus would go in his love and service.

Jesus' ultimate act of love occurs in his willingness to be handed over to be mocked, tortured, and executed for the crimes or sins committed by all of humanity. We remember on Good Friday that like those who were in Jerusalem, Jesus hangs on the Cross for our sins—not for his own.

So you see, there is a lot more to Easter than the empty tomb—more than the candy and the little girls in dresses. Please be sure to experience the story this year at our special Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services. Prepare your hearts for the ultimate joy of Jesus' Resurrection this Easter!





From Amazon's web site:

The renowned and beloved *New York Times* bestselling author of *An Altar in the World* and *Learning to Walk in the Dark* recounts her moving discoveries of finding the sacred in unexpected places while teaching the world's religions to undergraduates in rural Georgia, revealing how God delights in confounding our expectations.

Barbara Brown Taylor continues her spiritual journey begun in *Leaving Church* of finding out what the world looks like after taking off her clergy collar. In *Holy Envy*, she contemplates the myriad ways other people and traditions encounter the Transcendent, both by digging deeper into those traditions herself and by seeing them through her students' eyes as she sets off with them on field trips to monasteries, temples, and mosques.

Throughout *Holy Envy*, Taylor weaves together stories from the classroom with reflections on how her own spiritual journey has been complicated and renewed by connecting with people of other traditions—even those whose truths are quite different from hers. The one constant in her odyssey is the sense that God is the one calling her to disown her version of God—a change that ultimately enriches her faith in other human beings and in God.

WHAT GOES INTO READING THE PRAYERS ON SUNDAY IN WORSHIP AND AM I CUT OUT FOR IT?

Each Sunday in worship a lay leader leads us in praying the “Prayers of the People,” which are provided in written form to the volunteer who has agreed to serve in this role. Some of our volunteers find it a joy and a spiritual exercise to write these prayers in their own words; others read what has been provided word-for-word.

The Prayers of the People are just that: Prayers that are raised within the congregation. For this reason, it is important that we have the prayers read by members of the assembly and not simply by the Pastor. For some, praying out loud can be intimidating. However, you are encouraged to consider volunteering for this worship leadership role. Please let Pastor Stephanie or Jessica know if you are willing to serve in this way.



ELCA WORLD HUNGER APPEAL PROGRAM

On March 17, sixteen of us were fortunate to be able to enjoy learning more about our ELCA World Hunger Appeal program. Sharon Magnuson from the ELCA Hunger Program was here at the adult faith formation class, where she shared information on what we are able to do through this program, like supporting the Welders Co-op in Rwanda. The welding school there provides very valuable instruction in a manufacturing program that has a lot of demand.

We also learned about how we can support global farms and that 80% of the world’s food comes from the farms of small landowners.

There is also a new data base that we have supported here in the U.S. called MEANS : Matching Excess And Needs. This database has the potential to help people dealing with an excess of leftovers to get that food to people who can use it.

With regard to our World Hunger Appeal giving here at Trinity, we have come close to matching the \$500, but not quite. I’m hopeful that in the next couple of weeks we might meet that goal. I look forward to reporting that in next month’s *Builder*.

MARCH COUNCIL MEETING NOTES

Pastor's Stephanie's Report: With the help of Pamela Wong, I have begun hosting coffee and snacks in the fellowship hall on Weds. afternoons for parents/families of the Joyful Noise singers. This has provided a lovely time of conversation for me to get to know the families better, and a good space for the siblings of singers to spend some of their energy in a non-distracting way. Our Sunday morning Adult Faith Formation conversations, using *By Heart*, continue successfully and will probably last until the end of the academic year. This month we have discussed the Lord's Prayer and have hosted Sharon Magnuson from the ELCA World Hunger Appeal. For the future, I am looking for other materials that are equally as interesting to attendees.

The new website will go live April 1.

After there were issues with the sound system in the fellowship hall at the congregation meeting and the Mardi Gras fundraiser, I spent time working to make the single microphone and an auxiliary cable for sound from a computer/phone/ other outside source work together, as long as no one touches anything. The amplifier system is very old and finicky. I believe investing \$500 in a new mixer and amplifier may be a good idea this year, but is not urgent.

Additionally, Steve Garner has been researching the purchase and installation of a hearing loop system for the sanctuary. This system allows those with hearing aids to have sound from the sound system directly delivered to their hearing aids rather than people having to adjust their hearing aids to the ambient noise of the room.

27 people attended the Ash Wednesday service on March 6 at noon at Trinity. The Lenten worship and suppers with Immanuel continue to go well. Pastor Dot and I are basing our meditations on a book called *Spiritual Women: Encountering the First Women Disciples* by Mary Ellen Ashcraft. There is expression of interest in the topic from congregation and community members alike.

Committee Reports:

Christian education: Steve Garner is stepping down as chair of the Education Committee.

Mission and Service: Doug Biggs from Alameda Point Collaborative presented information on Measure A at a forum at Trinity on March 16.

Property: The annual spring clean-up day is scheduled for Saturday, April 6, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

The amount needed to finishing paying off the roof project is \$6,446.33.

WELCA: Pastor Stephanie is interested in having a women's retreat. Elizabeth Madaras is looking into it.

Worship and Music: The most exciting development has been the creation of "Coffee Hour" for families when they come to Joyful Noise. Pastor Stephanie started this a few weeks ago, and Pamela Wong has taken it on as a special project. Through this initiative, she and Pastor Stephanie are helping to connect families to us and to each other. Pamela has also offered to help provide this kind of support at events like our spring concert and Parents Night Out on April 12. It is time to send another family update via Mail Chimp to the families that signed up to receive announcements related to youth events. Julie Haydon has created these but wishes for someone else to do this job in the future.

Old/New Business

Anita Burnaford and Elizabeth Madaras will attend the Synod Convention on May 11 in Lodi as our voting members.

We will celebrate Trinity's 75th anniversary with a luncheon after the 10:30 worship service on either May 19 or June 2.

The heaters in the fellowship hall along the Morton Street side are not working. Anita has asked Ken Gutleben and Geoff Burnaford to investigate.

The stage curtain in the fellowship hall is deteriorating. Mary Kay Wentz has suggested a fix, which will buy us some time before we need to replace the curtain entirely.

Anita Burnaford has created a document of items that the council needs to address at certain times of the year. She feels this would be very helpful for incoming council members, and it can be adjusted as needed.

Nursery attendant Meng Li will be leaving at the end of May as she graduates from school. We are looking for a new nursery attendant.

The next council meeting will be April 11.
