The second covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the one made with Abraham and Sarah: God's promise to make them the ancestors of many, with whom God will remain in everlasting covenant. Paul says this promise comes to all who share Abraham's faith in the God who brings life into being where there was no life. We receive this baptismal promise of resurrection life in faith. Sarah and Abraham receive new names as a sign of the covenant, and we too get new identities in baptism, as we put on Christ.

↓ SECOND READING Romans 4:13-25

¹³The promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

¹⁶For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, ¹⁷as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations")—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. 18 Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." 19He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. 20 No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, 21being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²²Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." 23 Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not

for his sake alone, ²⁴but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, ²⁵who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC, FROM STARR This month we've heard a lot of music in observance of Black History month. Today I've chosen pieces by Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912), the first African British composer to garner international acclaim. His father was from Sierra Leone and his mother was English. At age 15 he began studies at the Royal College of Music, first as a violin major and then switching to composition, and soon published a symphony. He came to America in 1904 and was introduced to African American spirituals. For his first collection of spirituals, 24 Negro Melodies, he wrote, "What Brahms has done for the Hungarian folk music, Dvorak for the Bohemian, and Grieg for the Norwegian, I have tried to do tor these Negro Melodies." He died of pneumonia at age 37.

LENTEN MID-WEEK WORSHIP This year our mid-week Lenten worship will happen on Wednesday afternoons at 2:00pm. We hope this will make the service more accessible to those who prefer not to get out in the dark. We plan to worship in the style of Taizé. The Taizé service is a contemplative prayer service developed in the monastic community in Taizé, France. Characteristics of this service - repetitive prayer set to simple musical lines, liturgical readings, and silence – have been adapted by Christian communities outside of Taizé, France, to provide the bases for meditative services.
